Ground Breaking Ceremony of Huizhou Quanwan International Container Terminals

On 16 January, Hutchison Port Holdings and Huizhou Port Affairs Group Company Limited broke ground on two 50,000-tonne container berths at Huizhou Quanwan International Container Terminals (HQCT), which will soon become Huizhou Port's first dedicated container terminal.

The groundbreaking ceremony was attended by over 400 guests, representing the municipal government, local enterprises as well as top executives from the port and shipping industries. Huang Yebin, Party Secretary of the Huizhou Municipal Committee of the Communist Party of China; Li Ruqiu, Mayor of Huizhou; John Meredith, Group Managing Director of HPH; James S. Tsien, Managing Director of Hutchison Ports China; and Zhong Jiayun, Chairman and President of Huizhou Port Affairs Group Company Limited, jointly hosted the event.

HQCT, which is served by comprehensive road and rail networks, will have a total berth length of 800 metres, an area of 60 hectares, and a depth alongside and approaching channel of 15.2 metres. Upon completion, it will help transform Huizhou Port into one of South China's leading container ports.
